## Financial Support toward the cost of the Book Rental Scheme

The Department of Education and Skills give all schools funding to support Needy Students

A needy student is defined as a student from a family where there is:

- Genuine hardship because of unemployment or short time working
- Prolonged illness of a parent
- Large family size with inadequate means
- Single parenthood
- Other family circumstances (e.g. alcoholism) indicating a similar degree of financial hardship

The Department of Education and Science guidelines divide such families into the following three categories:

• Families which are dependent mainly on social welfare payments

• Families on low incomes from employment (Such families should be in receipt of the Family Income Supplement (FIS) or beneficiaries under the Back-to-School Clothing and Footwear scheme)

• Families which are experiencing financial hardship because of particular circumstances in the home

Entitlement to a medical card is not necessarily an indication of eligibility.

If you require support please see the application form on the website. Fill it out and bring it to the school office for my attention please.

## School Self Evaluation and School Improvement Planning

Since 2014 we are working on School Self Evaluation and School Improvement Planning initiatives. We have focused on Literacy, Numeracy, Assessment For Learning and Mind Mapping. This year we concentrated on Wellbeing. Two teachers conducted research on Classroom Culture and Wellbeing. The research established that our students loved teachers' comments on their work and in particular 'Two Stars and a Wish', with this approach the teachers highlights two aspects of the student's work that were very good and recommends an area for improvement.

In 2018-2019 we will be concentrating on Reporting. In March 2018 the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment issued Reporting Guidelines. In light of the New Junior Cycle that includes Classroom Based Assessment, Subject Learning and Assessment Review meetings and new descriptors in school examinations we will be consulting with parents, students and staff in the coming year.
