

- Level 8 Honours Degree 3/4 years


MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR FURTHER EDUCATION

- Level 8 Honours Degrees
- 3/4 years study
- Min. of 2 H5 and 4 O6/H7 (TCD & a small no. of level 8 courses Min 3 H5 and 3 O6/H7)
- Level 7 Ordinary Degrees
- -3 years study
- -Min. 5 O6/H7
- Level 6 Higher Certificate
- 2 years study
- -Min 5 O6/H7
- Post Leaving Certificate Courses
- 1 year study
- Min. 5 passes in H/O/F



Doctorate: Several years of self-directed study and Level 10 research. Masters: A 1-2 year course taken after a Level 8. Level 9 Post-graduate Diploma: A 1 year course taken after a Level 8. Higher Diploma: A 1-year course taken after a bachelor degree. Level 8 Honours Bachelor Degree: Usually a 3/4-year course in college. Level 7 Ordinary Bachelor Degree: Usually three years of study in college. Higher Certificate: Leads to employment or higher education. Level 6 Advanced Certificate: Training in work-specific skills. Level 5 Certificate: Two years of study, usually aimed at employment. Level 5 Leaving Certificate: A general education award placed at Levels 4 and 5. Level 4 Level 4 Certificate: Training in personal or work related skills. Junior Certificate: A general education award placed at Level 3. Level 3 Level 3 Certificate: Training in specific personal/practical skills and knowledge. Level 2 Certificate: Training in basic literacy, numeracy, and general education. Level 2 Level 1 Certificate: Training in fundamental literacy and numeracy. Level 1

AWARDS IN THE FRAMEWORK

There are four types of award in the National Framework of Qualifications:

- Major Awards: are the principal class of awards made at a level
- ▲ Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award
- Supplemental Awards: are for learning that is additional to a Major Award
- Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement



What is the CAO?

What is the CAO?

Central Applications Office based in Galway.



What do they do?

They process all applications to undergraduate courses in Higher Education Institutions (HEIs).

What do they NOT do?

They do not SET the points each year.

Key CAO dates

- 20th January, 2020 5.15pm
 - Closing date for receipt of early online application
- 1st February, 2020 5.15pm
 - Closing date for receipt of normal application (Restricted entry)
- 1st May, 2020
 - Closing date for receipt of late applications
- From May 5th, 2020
 - Change of mind facility becomes available .
- 1st July, 2020
 - Latest date for receipt of change of mind form in CAO.
- 19th August (expected date), 2020
 - First round of offers will commence.

Genuine order of preference!!

How Places are Allocated?

- When examination <u>results</u> are released in August they are entered into the CAO computer.
- The computer checks each applicant's results.
 For each course the applicant has applied for,
 the computer first determines if the applicant has
 the minimum entry requirements for the course.

How Places are Allocated?

- If the applicant meets the minimum entry requirements for the course, the applicant's points are calculated for this course choice.
- All eligible applicants are then placed in a list, in order of the points they achieved, for each course that they applied for.






How Places are Allocated?

- The colleges then tell CAO how many places are to be offered on each course.
- CAO then makes offers to the required number of applicants on each course starting with the applicant with the highest points and working down until enough places have been offered.






These are the applicants for CK101 (Arts in UCC)


The examination results have not yet been released, so these applicants are in no particular order.

We are going to trace the progress of the applicant marked in red.



Results are issued. Applicants are placed in a queue for each course they applied for, their position in the queue is determined by their points. The applicant with the highest points is placed at the top of the queue.

The points achieved by the applicant in red determines her position in the queue for each course he applied to.



The applicants marked in green have enough points to be offered places.

The applicant marked in red has enough points for his second preference.

The applicant in red is offered his second preference, the highest preference course that he has enough points for, and he will now disappear from the queue in all his lower choices.

- Students will now be given a shorter number of days to accept the offer but very important to check the deadline date given with the offer.
- If offered Level 8 and Level 6/7 offer, accepting one automatically rejects the other.

 Rejecting an offer does NOT guarantee that you will get another – Think carefully! In the Second round of offers three more offers are made on CK101 and our applicant, who was second in line, now receives an offer.

He may do nothing and remain in DN201 or he may accept the offer and begin in CK101.



Points depend on.....

- How many places are available on a particular course?
- How many applicants there are for that particular course?
- What points they scored in their Leaving Certificate?



Genuine Order of Preference



- You do not need to guess what the points are going to be for the courses you are interested in.
- Simply list your courses in genuine order of preference from the highest preference 1, to the lowest preference 10.
- If you are entitled to an offer, you will be offered the highest preference that you are entitled to.

Common Errors

- Not enough research into courses
- Listing courses in order of points instead of genuine preference
- Underestimating / overestimating Leaving Certificate results
- Targeting low point courses in hope of getting College place
- Targeting Level 8 courses only and ignoring Level 7 & 6 courses thereby <u>Ladder of Opportunity</u>
- Not considering courses outside certain geographic areas

Dos / 'Don'ts of CAO Applications

- Do choose ten options if at all possible
- Do list courses in order of genuine preference
- Do make sure to have other options if you do not get your preferences e.g. PLC course
- Do check Alert Lists on CAO website

Dos / 'Don'ts of CAO Applications

• Do not depend totally on getting the 1st, 2nd or 3rd choice

You may be offered your 4th / 5th / 6th / 7th / 8th / 9th / 10th choice. Be prepared for this and choose wisely!

 Do not disregard the GENUINE ORDER OF PREFERENCE rule!

- **Do not** ignore the Level 6/7 route
- Do not target only low point courses in hope of getting to College

PLC/CFE Courses Post Leaving Certificate Courses

- Good, recognised qualification
- Also may allow students to go onto Degree courses in colleges based on their performance.

• Should apply from January 2020 directly to the PLC






