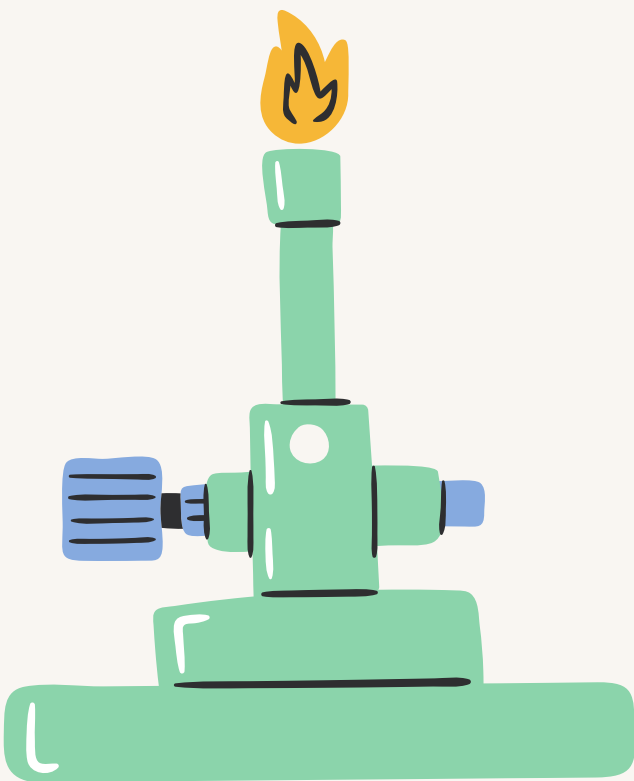
Scifest

LGFA IN NOVEMBER



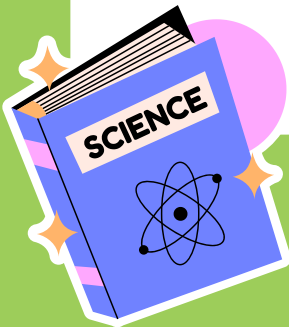

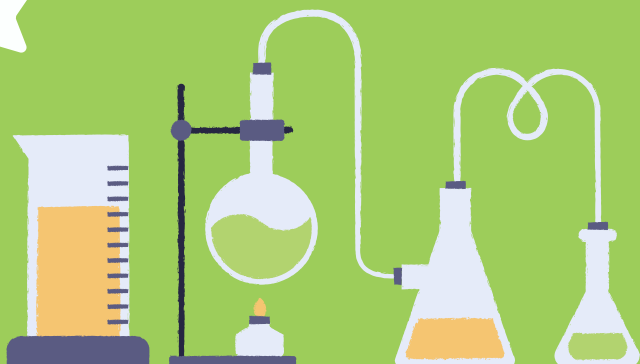
Science Week

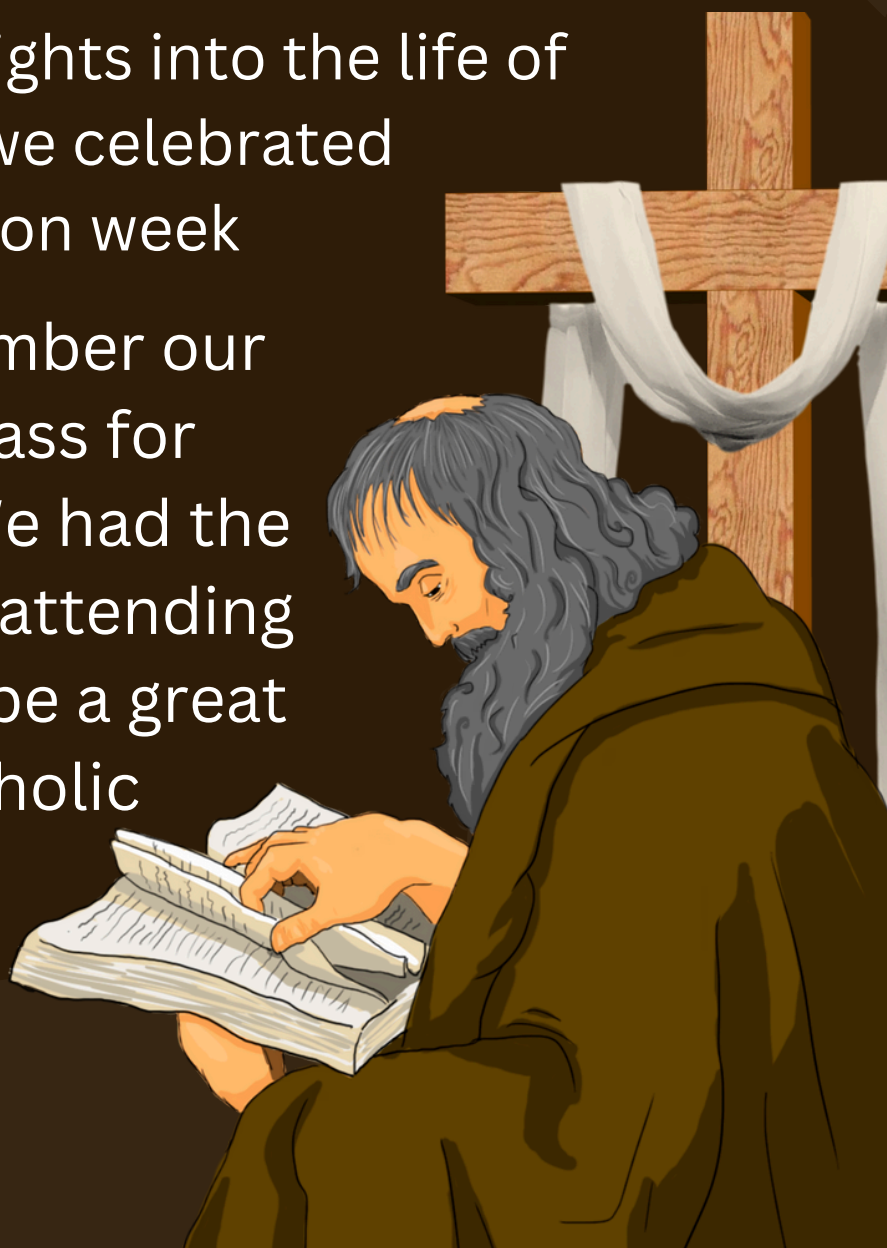


Catholic Ethos

LISTOWEL FOOD FAIR

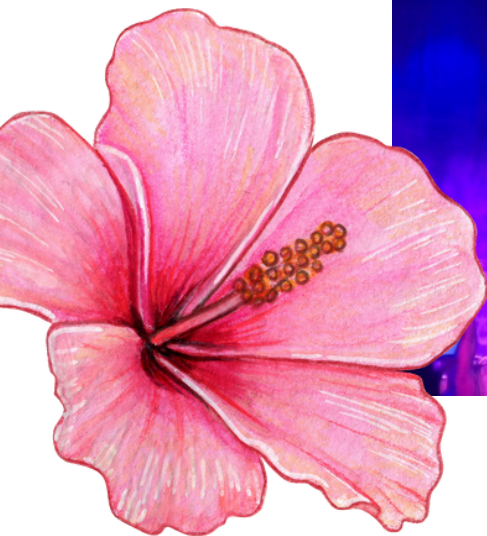
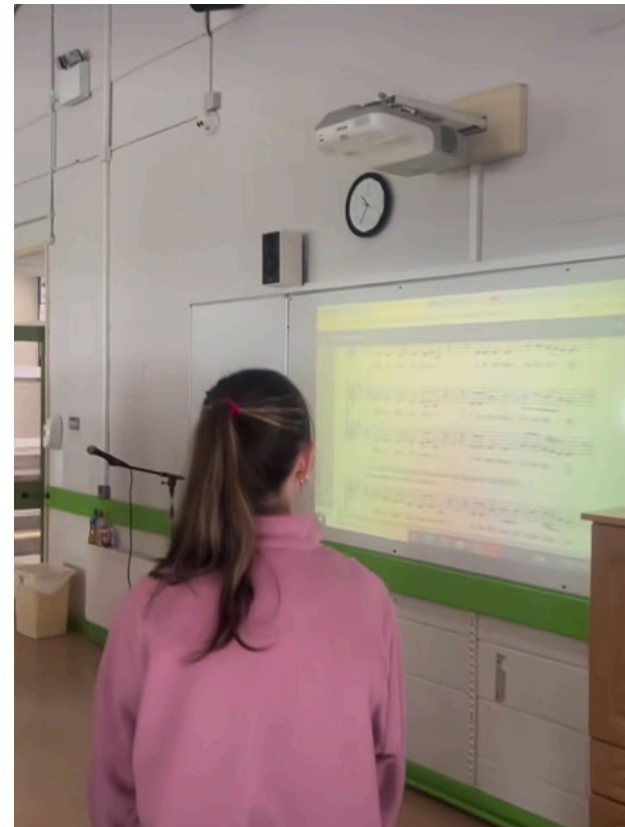
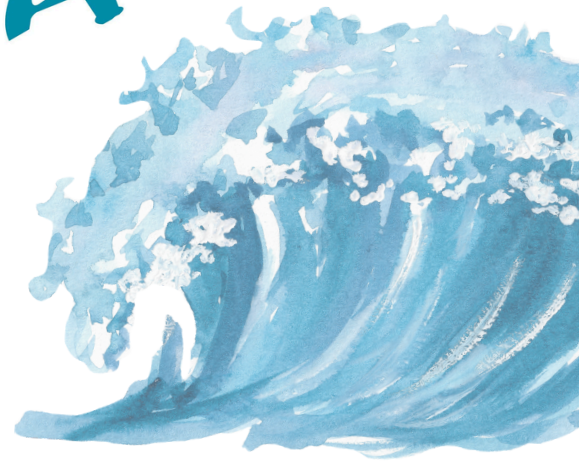

This gave the students a better understanding of what subjects they would like to study for the leaving cert.

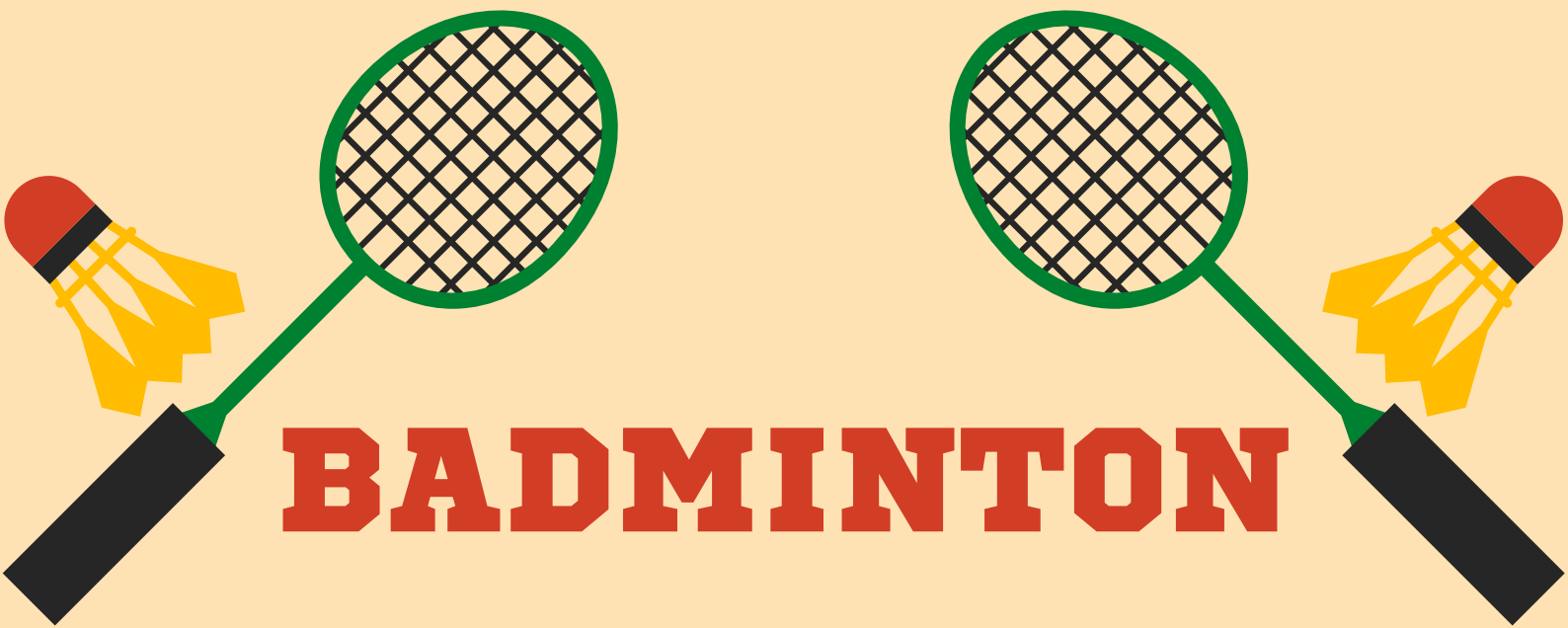

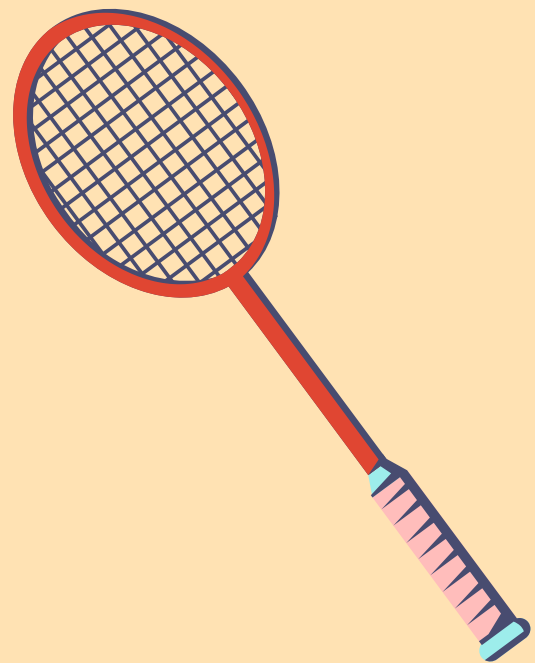




BADMINTON

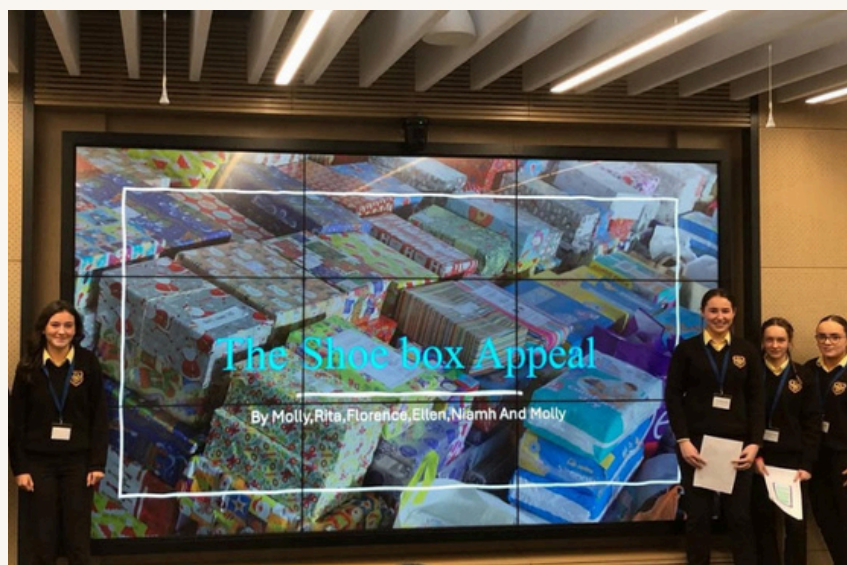
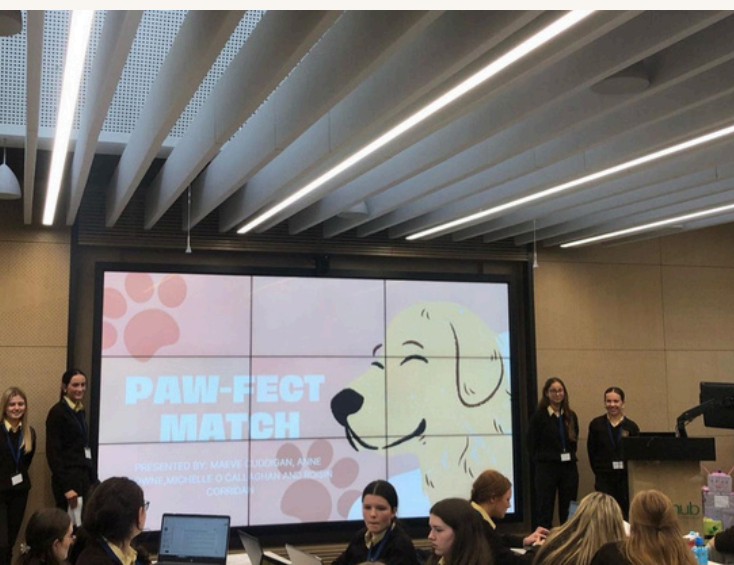


STEM PASSPORT OF INCLUSION
