THEY BOTH TRAGICALLY DIE.




BRDYEAR GARDA VISIT



SECOND YEAR TRIP





Bridget.








JUNK KOUTURE






TOBAR NUA

SNOW WEEK

On the 5th of January 2025, Ireland experienced heavy snowfall, which lasted for a week.

Almost 60,000 homes, farms and businesses were without power, mostly in counties Cork, Kerry, Limerick, Tipperary, Carlow, Laois and Wicklow. About 15,000 people were also without water.

A Status Orange snow and ice warning were in place until midnight on Sunday for Leinster, Munster, Cavan and Monaghan
