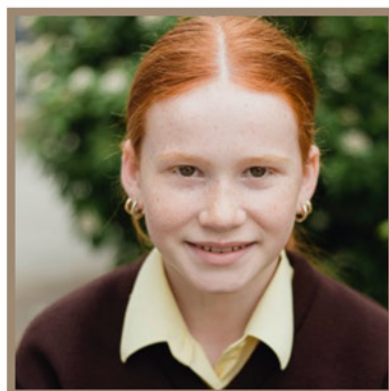
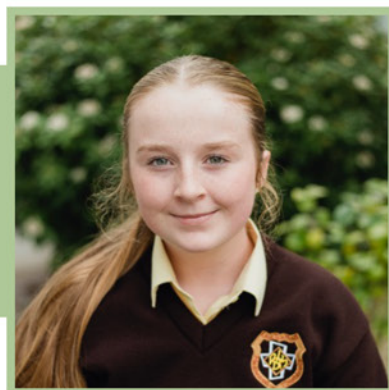

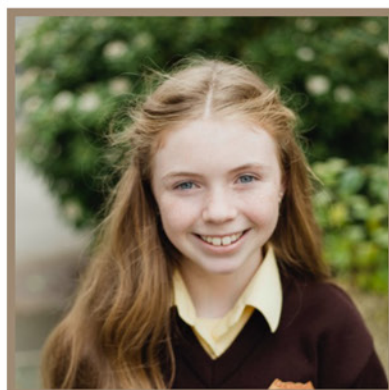

EXCELLING IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

At present, Presentation Secondary School, Listowel offers five programmes:

The school has an allocation of 1 special class to support students with autism.



JUNIOR CYCLE

The Framework for Junior Cycle, provides the basis for post-primary schools to plan quality, inclusive and relevant education programmes with improved learning experiences for all students, including those with special educational needs. This enables all learners to achieve their full potential and contribute to Ireland's economic, social and cultural development. Students study compulsory subjects like English, Gaelge, and Maths, a significant Wellbeing Programme, and may also engage with Level 2 Learning Programmes for different learning needs

LEAVING CERTIFICATE APPLIED (LCA)

If a student is looking for a blended approach to senior cycle education where practical hands-on learning is combined with academic work, then The Leaving Cert Applied (LCA) programme may be the solution. Our award-winning, well-established LCA programme is a two-year fully recognised Leaving Certificate for students who thrive in practical learning environments. It emphasises real-world experiences and the development of transferable skills that are invaluable in today's world. Assessment is continuous throughout and students can build up credits as they learn reducing the pressure where success is dependent on one final exam. Students can progress onto third-level education, apprenticeships or employment.

LEAVING CERTIFICATE

Along with the core subjects of English, Gaeilge and Mathematics, we provide a wide range of subject for the Leaving Certificate.

ST. MICHAEL'S COLLEGE

We have a very successful partnership with St. Michael's College, Listowel for Senior Cycle students which affords students with the opportunity to choose a wider range of subject options including Physical Education(exam), Physics, Accounting and Engineering.

DEDICATED LEARNING SUPPORT

There is a deep commitment in this school to supporting students with Additional Educational Needs (AEN) through a caring, inclusive, and student-centred approach. Guided by the Department of Education's Continuum of Support framework, we provide structured and flexible interventions tailored to each student's needs.

Support is delivered at three key levels:

Support for All: High-quality, differentiated teaching ensures that all students benefit from a positive and inclusive learning environment.

Support for Some: Targeted interventions are provided for students who require additional support in specific areas of learning, wellbeing, or behaviour.

Support for a Few: Individualised, intensive support is offered for students with more complex or long-term needs, often in collaboration with external agencies and specialists.

Working closely with parents, students, and professionals, our AEN team ensures that every learner is supported to reach their full potential - academically, socially, and emotionally - within the inclusive ethos of our school

Supports for mainstream students with Learning Difficulties/Special Educational Needs include but are not limited to:



One-to-one teaching



Small group resource



Team teaching in core subjects (Maths and English)



Assistive technology (where applicable)



SNA support (where applicable)



Reasonable accommodation for state exams

SPECIAL CLASS (ASD)

This class caters specifically for students with a diagnosis of autism and allows for specialised, individual, and small group teaching for students, who also remain integrated with the mainstream student body. Our class reflects the inclusive ethos in Presentation Secondary School which is based on the belief that students with special needs should receive their education within the most supportive environment. The focus on realising the full potential of each individual student will endeavour to develop the students' life skills and prepare them for life after school in an ever-evolving model of best practice. Students who have written confirmation from the National Council for Special Education of their eligibility for the special class are entitled to apply for a place in the class as per the admissions policy.

Supporting Exceptionally Able Children

In addition to providing for students with additional learning needs, we recognise and support Exceptionally Able Students. All staff have received training in supporting the exceptionally able and a dedicated team to supporting the students.

SNAs

Our Special Needs Assistants (SNAs) provide invaluable shared support to students with additional care needs, enabling them to access the curriculum and fully participate in school life.

Working under the guidance of the SEN team and classroom teachers, SNAs offer practical assistance in areas such as mobility, communication, and organisation while also fostering independence and self-confidence in students.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING

A multi-million new building project will begin in the coming months at Presentation Secondary School. The two-storey extension will offer new subject classrooms, Special Education Needs rooms, a Sensory room and Science Labs. The building will extend on to the Ballybunion road side of the current building.

Following on from the installation of new windows and doors throughout the current school building as well as 4 additional modular classrooms in 2023 the school offers excellent facilities, and the additional accommodation will ensure that the school continues to be a leading provider of education in North Kerry.

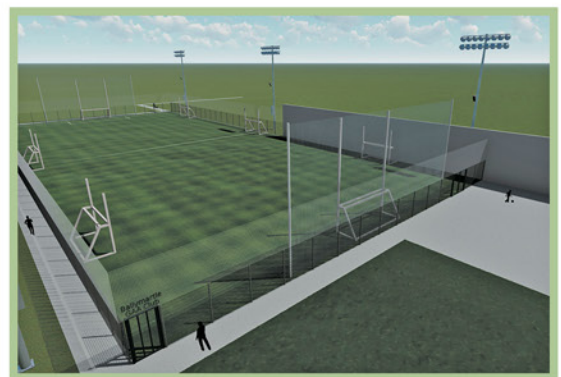
As a lead school for STEM, the new Science labs will ensure that the students continue to achieve at the highest level in this area. The school is delighted to be chosen to participate in the STEM Passport for Inclusion and students from the school have successfully presented projects at Sci Fest and BT Young Scientist competitions.

The SEN rooms and the sensory room will enhance the provision for students with additional needs. The school already has a designated ASD class in keeping with the school ethos of providing inclusive learning environment for all. It is a most exciting time for the whole school community at Presentation Secondary School, Listowel.



ALL-WEATHER FACILITY

Presentation Secondary School and Listowel Emmets Ladies Football Club are delighted to have received funding for the development of a new All-Weather Facility and associated LED lighting for multi-use games purpose. The facility will be located on the grounds of Presentation Secondary School, Listowel. This development will further support our students wellbeing and encourage continued participation in sports. The facility will provide year-round all-weather access to football, soccer and other athletic opportunities for our students.

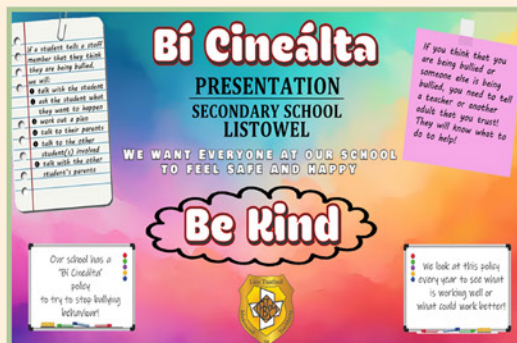
MENTORING

Our First year students are paired with Transition Year mentors to ensure a smooth transition. Mentors play a valuable role in creating a positive school spirit, and supporting the First Years settle into their new school. Mentors meet First Year students regularly, providing support and guidance as well as having lots of fun activities together!



ANTI BULLYING Bí Cineálta

Our school has established a "Bí Cineálta" team which consists of staff and student representatives from each year group. The 'Bí Cineálta' procedures are centered on a child rights-based approach and support a partnership approach where all members of the school community work together to prevent and address bullying behaviour.



HELPING HANDS ABP

Helping Hands is an award-winning programme, which has been implemented across our school for the past number of years. It has been developed through rigorous research and is based on international best practice and leading thinking. It provides cutting edge knowledge, skills and an easy-to-use diagnostic tool to help teachers and Year Heads access relationship dynamics hidden in the peer group. This new approach means that vulnerable students can be identified before problems escalate, permitting appropriate supports to be put in place. The focus is on empowerment of the victims and keeping them psychologically safe.

WELLBEING

The wellbeing of our students is at the core of what we value, as it is vital in order for students to achieve their full potential. We nurture positive relationships with peers and staff to help our students feel safe, supported and connected to the school community.

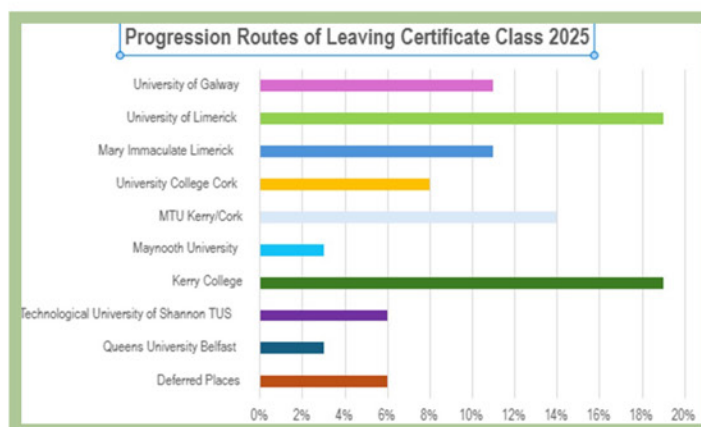
GUIDANCE & COUNSELLING

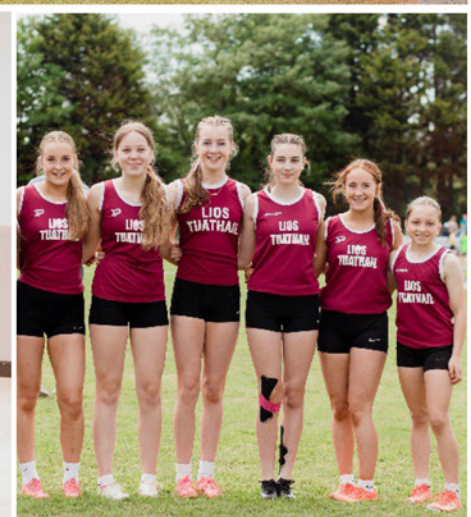


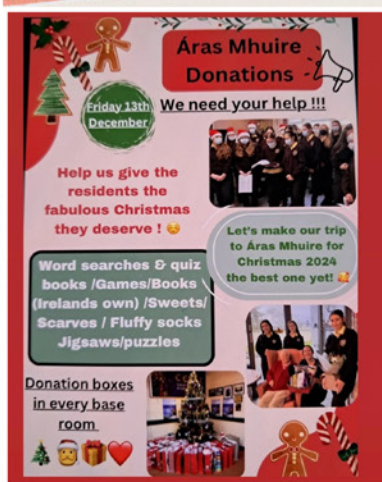

STARTING FIRST YEAR AT PRESENTATION LISTOWEL

A SMOOTH AND SUPPORTIVE TRANSITION

Moving from primary to secondary school is a major milestone in a young student's life. At Presentation Listowel, we understand that this can be both an exciting and daunting time for students and their families. That's why we go above and beyond to make the transition into First Year as smooth, supportive and reassuring as possible. We pride ourselves on creating a warm, inclusive environment where every student feels welcome, valued and understood from the very beginning.

Through strong relationships with our feeder primary schools, we take the time to get to know each student's individual needs, strengths and interests — even before they set foot in the building as First Years.

- **Early Induction** - Sixth class pupils visit Presentation Secondary School multiple times, taking part in fun team-building activities, Open Evenings and Induction Days while getting to know teachers, classmates and the layout of the school.
- **Parental Involvement** - We value partnership with parents, holding information sessions both before and after entry to keep families fully informed and involved.
- **Pastoral Support** – Every First Year class is assigned a caring Class Tutor, overseen by a dedicated Year Head, who monitors both academic and personal development.
- **Mentoring Buddy System** - Our trained Transition Year mentors provide First Years with friendly faces, helpful advice and daily support to help them feel secure and confident.
- **Academic Guidance** - Wellbeing classes cover study techniques and time management,
- **Tailored Learning Support** - Our Special Education team provides personalised plans and in-class assistance for students with additional learning needs.

Activities - From team-building days to First Year trips, interclass camogie and basketball leagues and club introductions, students have every opportunity to build friendships and feel part of school life.

At Presentation Listowel, we are deeply committed to nurturing the personal growth and emotional wellbeing of each student. We want every student to feel a true sense of belonging and to know that they are supported every step of the way. From day one, our ethos is clear: you are cared for and you are part of a supportive learning community.
